



A year of arts and culture in our libraries

The nights are drawing in but our year of culture is still going strong. Haltor Libraries' third festival of the year is all about stories. Our Let's Tell Our Stories festival celebrates all our stories and hears our voices through storytelling art, reminiscence, performance and talks. It will highlight traditional stories contemporary stories and will shine a light on tales from the local area and from much further afield.

We have local history talks and screenings exploring the stories of Runcorn and Widnes; storytelling for both grown-ups and children that will weave magical and fantastical stories from places and times far away; we have artist led workshops that will delve into theatrical storytelling, poetry and the new art form of creating digital sound stories. There is amazing Brazilian drumming that will explore the heritage and stories of Brazil passed down through rhythmic and energetic beats; dance and walkabout theatre performance where the audience will experience visual storytelling; and let's not forget the ultimate festive story of A Christmas Carol, a fantastic theatre production to end our year of culture. Plus, you can visually share your very own stories with us in our Paint Your Story sessions!

Don't forget, there are weekly story time sessions in all of our libraries and keep a regular look out on our website for pop up storytelling events.

Cloch: A 19th century tall ship voyage - A talk by Ian Bellard

Local speaker and author, Ian Bellard, will fascinate and intrigue us by telling us his true story based on his great-grandfather's first-hand account of a 19th-century two-year voyage aboard the tall ship, Cloch.

In 1897 Ian's great-grandfather Joseph T. Rowland embarked upon a two year voyage aboard the Glasgow built barque Cloch. From Liverpool he sailed to San Francisco, South Africa and Chile rounding Cape Horn four times and along the way being inducted into the court of King Neptune as he crossed the equator. In later years, he wrote an account of his voyage, the document of which provides the inspiration for this fascinating talk.

Ian will read extracts from Joseph's log, and use photographs and background information on 19th century sailing life to enhance and bring to life this fascinating story. "An absorbing and graphic account." Runcorn Weekly News

Tom Rea Smith studied Sound Art at the Royal College of Art and holds an MMus and PhD in music composition from the University of Liverpool. He teaches on the MA in Popular Music at BIMM in Manchester. Working with Sam Meech and Raz Ullah, he was shortlisted for the Lumen Prize for Art and Technology in 2019 for Portal, an interactive sound and video installation presented at Liverpool Central Library as part of Liverpool Light Night 2019 and in Manchester, London and Montreal subsequently.




